## **Compound Sentences**

A compound sentence is made up of two simple sentences joined by a comma and a coordinating conjunction such as and, but, or or.

Simple Sentences

The horned toad looks like a toad. It is really

a lizard.

Compound Sentence The horned toad looks like a toad, but it is

really a lizard.

The two sentences in a compound sentence must have ideas that make sense together.
